

Learn to Listen through Improv



Effective communication requires both good speaking and listening skills. Learn to listen and be attentive to your audience.

Whether in a job interview, a presentation of your work to colleagues or the public, or around your workplace, excellent communication skills are essential to create a productive and supportive environment. Communication is two-way, so listening attentively and positively is extremely important. This workshop will give you some basic tools and training to help you develop your listening skills. Improvisation is a team activity and depends on listening and paying attention to your partners. This workshop will be led by a professional improviser from Hartford's own improvisation theater, Sea Tea Improv. This is not meant to make you a comedian nor an actor. You will not be expected to get up on a stage to perform. We will use group and partner activities to help build your skills and confidence as a listener.
